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National educational issues

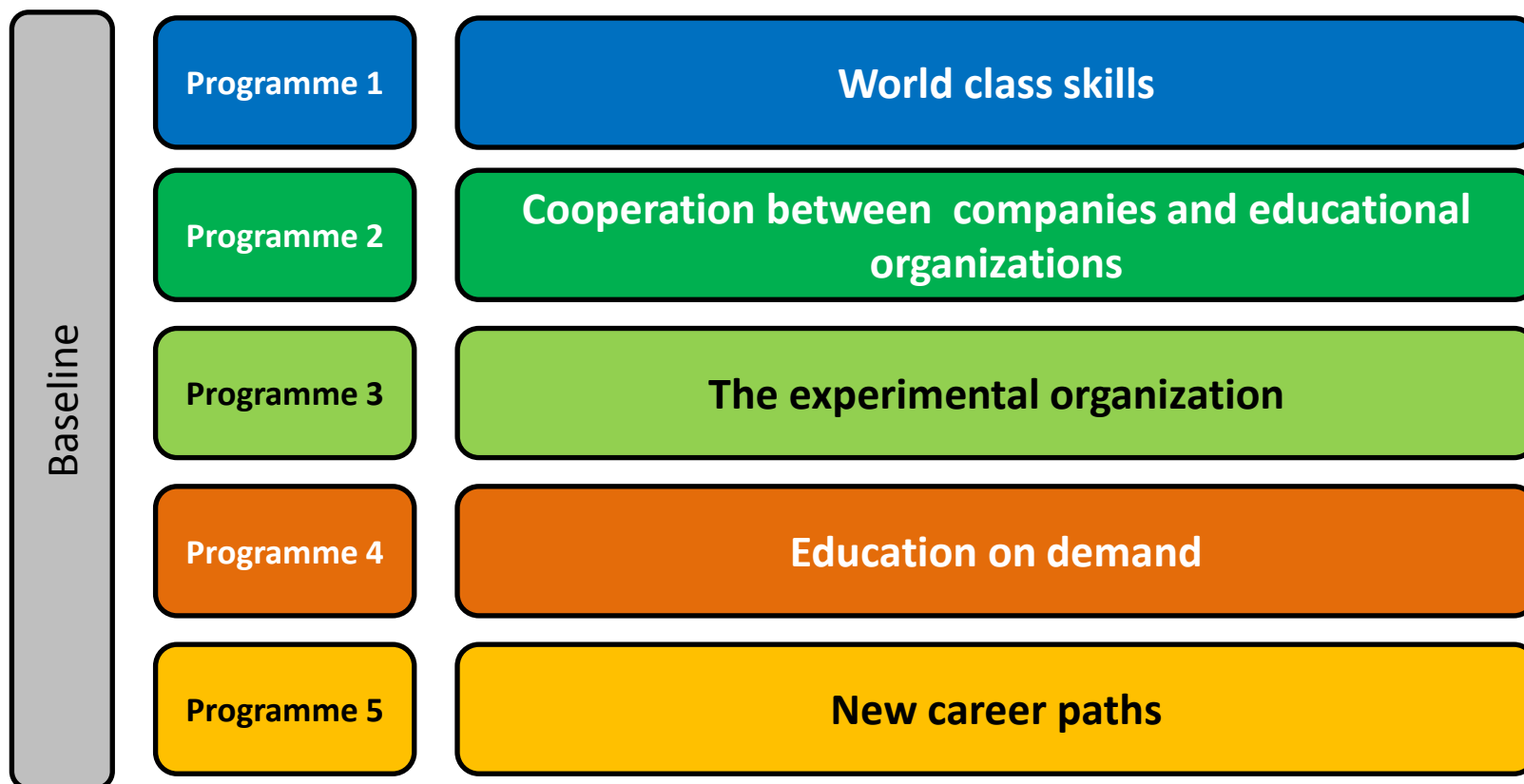
- Dropout rate is increasing – despite massive effort to approach it
- Lack of approximately 10.000 apprenticeships
- VET – Have a low status among youngsters – only 1 out of 5 goes directly from ground school til VET.
- Increasing problems with absence and lack of motivation among students
- Unemployment among graduates increases
- Increasing number of students with psychological and/or social issues (the most frequent cause for dropout)

Mission:

- To establish an experimental setting based on knowledge by:
 - creating a unique experimental environment – VET to Ph.D.
 - Connecting educational practice, development and research to ensure knowledge that works in new ways
 - Developing new structures within the organization
 - Creating sustainable and meaningful partnerships
